Welcome to (take a deep breath, it's a long title ...) *The ULTIMATE Grants Toolkit: Essential Worksheets, Blueprints, and Step-By-Step Planning Guides to Help You Build A+ Proposals – and Great Grant-Funded Projects!*

With a title like that, who needs an introduction?

Well, we do. A few words, at least ... to make sure you know everything you need to know about the resource you're holding in your hand, so you can get the very most from it.

The Disclaimer

First, the disclaimer: *The ULTIMATE Grants Toolkit* will not teach you how to write grant proposals. There's a lot you can learn through *ULTIMATE* about writing grant proposals – and I hope you will! – but that isn't its primary purpose.

Plenty of terrific books and other resources are already out there that can guide you step by step through the how-to's. Rather, *The ULTIMATE Grants Toolkit* is exactly what its name indicates: A collection of tools – planning tools, thinking tools, organizing and managing tools – that will support you in your grants success, *no matter what step-by-step process you follow*.

Let's take the tool analogy just a bit farther.

As a toolkit, *ULTIMATE* won't build your house for you. It won't tell you what kind of house you should build. It won't even tell you how to build that house.

It can – and will – provide the tools to help you *decide* what kind of house to build. It will show you how other people have built strong, exciting houses with these tools. And it will give you what you need to pull it all together, layer by layer, piece by piece. It will give you both the framework and the processes to set your own dreams into motion – to create -- by joining your imagination, passion, and good planning with the tools in this book – the house (grant-funded programs, projects, and services) of your dreams.

How to Use the Toolkit

The ULTIMATE Grants Toolkit is really two resources in one. The first is the one you're holding right now: The three-ring binder that contains the hard-copy print versions of all the planning tools and worksheets – as well as instructions and elucidations for putting them to work. The second is the collection of downloadable electronic-file versions of all the worksheets.

■ *Three-Ring Binder.* The material in the three-ring binder is organized into nine separate sections, by broad topic. You'll find explanatory text at the beginning of each section. The *ULTIMATE* tools and worksheets are numbered consecutively throughout the entire *Toolkit*, to make it easier for you to identify. The *Contents* page contains a complete page-ordered index of all the worksheets, by number and by name.

You'll find many ways to make use of the hard-copy printouts of the *ULTIMATE* tools. We chose to use a three-ring binder to make it easy for you to remove any worksheet for copying, taking notes, making updates, and so on. If you purchased your own copy of *ULTIMATE*, you have the publisher's blanket permission to reproduce any worksheet for your personal or organizational (non-commercial) use. For more details on terms and conditions of usage, please see the notice on the copyright page at the front of the notebook.

■ The Downloadable Files. All of the forms and worksheets contained in the notebook are also available to you as their own downloadable electronic file. When you purchased your *ULTIMATE*, you also received information on where to access these downloadable files. Just access the files and download them to your own computer – where you can access them any time you want. All files are in either Microsoft Word, Adobe PDF, or Excel format, depending on how the worksheets will be used.

We strongly recommend that you *copy all worksheet files directly to your own computer*. Then make a separate set of copies that you can modify without changing the original. That way you can make modifications to any file on your hard drive, and know that you always have a clean, untouched original version if you need it.

That means there's a lot of great thinking going on about how to do exactly that and we're proud to say that *The ULTIMATE Grants Toolkit* draws on some of that great thinking from our colleagues across the country. We invited other grant practitioners to share with us their own favorite grants-related planning and management tools and the stellar results are showcased in our section titled "Contributors' Gallery: Resources from the Grants Community."
